3rd November 2024

1st reading --- Micah 6:2-8

2nd reading --- 1 John 4:16-21

Theme: 'The Greatest commandment'

Message by Rev. Dr. Mithra.

The world Mission Sunday is celebrated this day, which began on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples that were waiting after Jesus' Ascension in the book of Acts chapters 1 and 2. A scribe asked Jesus about what is the greatest commandment of all. For which Jesus answered * to love your God and * to love your neighbor as you would love yourself. Jesus summarized the Ten Commandments into these two. If I may bring all the acres of land I own and the treasures that I have and offer it to God and have no reverence and show no obedience towards God, then those gifts would do no good in bringing me close to God. As St. Paul says in Romans 12:1 to present yourself as a living sacrifice to God. Sacrificing your will and accepting HIS. Three things the Lord require of you-- * Act Justly, * be merciful, * be humble.

Theme: 'Generous offering'

God told Moses to build a tabernacle so that HE could dwell among them and we see in Exodus 36: 2-7, that the Israelites offered generously for the building of the tabernacle. There offerings were so generous that the workers were unable to start the construction of the tabernacle because they were kept busy in collecting the generous offerings that were coming in. Moses had to announce to stop giving. When we enjoy God's blessing we give generously, we give the best and without grumbling. There is another instance in the book of Exodus 32:1—when Moses was with God at the mountain, the people gave up waiting for Moses and asked Aaron to lead them. He asked them to bring their ornaments and he made them a golden calf. Here also, the people made generous offerings but this act brought God's curse and anger on the people. So thus, it is important to discern where and to whom to give.

HIS hands. We thank God for HIS wonderful gift of rain and sunshine. Amos 4:7-8 shows us that God alone has the power to withhold rain from falling down on earth. We ought to recognize HIS authority over everything by just showing the right attitude of gratitude. Instead of boasting on our ability and hard work let us humble ourselves in HIS presence. *Deuteronomy 8:18 speaks to us that it is the LORD who gives us the ability to produce wealth. Nebuchadnezzar was a mighty king and had all the power with him. He had built magnificent cities for his own glory but he became so filled with pride that he forgot to glorify God, who allowed HIM to be a king at the first place. It is God alone who raise up kings and even brings them down. At once, he was cursed and was thrown into the wilderness where he lived like a wild beast for seven years. Therefore, always humble yourself under the mighty hand of God. * Deuteronomy 8:19 says that if we forget the Lord our God, then we shall surely be cursed. Therefore, let us look back and count all those numerous blessings of our God, which HE from time to time most graciously has blessed us.

Confessions have a negative connotation where people confess their sins to the priest/God in order to clear their conscience. Confession also means declaration. In the Gospel passage that was read, i.e. John 18:33-37, we see that Jesus declares that 'HE IS THE KING'. According to the Gospel the qualities that are required for us to be a citizen of the kingdom of God are; *1 John 4:7-11 describes what kind of people we ought to be. That we should love one another, which is possible only when God lives in us, the one who is born of God. * John 18:36-37, speaks of an upside down kingdom where our king (Christ Jesus) is gentle, meek, and kind. The principles and the doctrines of this kingdom differs from the principles of the earthly kingdom. In God's kingdom, there are no boundaries, race, color or ethnicity. Kingdoms come and go but HIS kingdom is forever. Here the king came to serve and not to serve and thus all those who want to be a citizen of the kingdom must first be servants. Let us strive to uphold the statutes and the principles of the kingdom of God as taught to us by our Lord Himself and prepare ourselves along with our families and friends to usher into the era of the Millennial rule of the eternal king, the Righteous one of Israel, Lord Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Advent: A Time for Kids?

Advent talks about the first coming and the Second coming of the Lord. The first one has been recorded in history and the second one epitomizes hope and expectation. As far as history is concerned, we look back to learn the lessons it teaches. The second one teaches us patient expectation.

At the outset I must confess that I had not heard about Advent until I was eighteen years old. In the area I was born, the time of Advent was never heard of. Perhaps many members of St. Paul's today who have come from many parts of this country might not have heard of it as well. Yet it is very good to know about Advent and Christmas, so that we prepare ourselves to meaningfully participate in them.

A Creedal Comma:

Are Advent and Christmas a time for the kids? Let us look at the creeds we confess in our Church services. The creeds say Jesus was "Born of the Virgin Mary, crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered, died and was buried". And then in the next sentence the Creed talks about his glorification. In this Creedal formulation what is not explained is His whole life and ministry on the earth. In all the Creeds the emphasis is not the person of Christ but the salvation of humankind. There was a big gap between Jesus' birth and His crucifixion. There was no mention about the earthly life of our Lord.

Even the hymns we sing during Advent and Christmas talk about Jesus' childhood and do not mention the earthly life of Jesus except hymn no 78 in our hymn book "The heavenly child in stature grows." This hymn was written by Jean-Baptiste de Santeus, a poet and musician who tried to take us through the earthly life of Jesus. But "Gentle Jesus, meek and mild," by Charles Wesley was not based on the gospels. And the details mentioned in hymn number 432 "And through all His wondrous childhood" which is stanza three of "Once in royal David city" written by Cicil Francic Alexander, are not found in the gospels. The question we may have to ask is if Jesus was passive, mild and gentle, why did He get crucified? Those qualities attributed to Jesus have very little verification in the gospels. On the contrary the description of Jesus as charismatic, gregarious, and incisive, is much more easily substantiated in the gospels. (John L Bell, UK).

Let us remember the birth narratives of Jesus found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Some information is given about the risk factors involved in his mother being pregnant and giving birth in the Palestinian context of the first century. Let us also think about the need for the family fleeing as refugees. Do you think these less savory elements of the story add or subtract from its significance?

In the present-day socio-political context of the world, how can we celebrate a meaningful Christmas?

The usual way is to feast and enjoy with friends and families and with all paraphernalia, and simply ignore the reality of children in many parts of the world, ravaged by wars and even natural calamities.

May God grant us a meaningful Christmas this year.
