



Messages from the Pulpit

Sunday sermons

5th January 2025

1st reading –Jeremiah 31: 1 and 7-9

2nd reading – Romans 8: 11-17

Theme: "we are Heirs in the son-ship of Christ"

Message by Rev. Mithra

Christ came to this world as the true Messiah of the world to save humankind from the burden of sin and its consequence. John writes in his gospel (John 1:10-11) that the very people HE created and set apart as HIS inheritance, rejected HIM. The religious leaders who studied the law knew about the prophecies about the Messiah coming and giving up HIS life for HIS people. But they failed to see these signs which followed every work Christ did. The apostle continues in verse 12, that all those accepted HIM, are given the right to be called Children of God. They are all given the entitlement of son-ship -- those who do God's will. St. Paul writes to the church in the epistle to the Romans 8:11-17, describing even further that the Spirit of God always leads these Children of God. We have been given opportunity after opportunity to listen to God's word in simple spoken language, from the pulpit messages, through various version and simplified Bibles; but it is falling on to deaf ears. Therefore, Christ Jesus has repeatedly spoken this line, saying 'he who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the Churches'. Are we all ears to the voice of the Holy Spirit who is actively participating in the transformation of souls? It is when we align our lives with the Will of God; we see that we walk in the power of Christ and will be able to do things that HE did.

12th January 2025 (Morning Service)

1st reading--- Isaiah 42:1-7

2nd reading--- Acts 8:26-40

Theme: Jesus' baptism signals the coming of a new age

Epiphany is a Greek word, which simply means "Manifestation". This is Manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Magi, or the manifestation of a great man of God - in Biblical terms, the Son of God. Indeed, the festival of Epiphany celebrates God's self-disclosure. God by nature reveals Himself in order to bring salvation to humankind. Creation is one such self-disclosure of God.

1) Creation as the self-manifestation of God's salvation act: In the creation story in Genesis 1:1-5 we have the first day of creation. The story begins with God's creative activity. The Spirit of God was hovering upon the surface of the waters, says the account. Hovering is the imagery of a bird, laying eggs and covering them under its pinions flying up and flying down to cover them. It is just the nature of God that He would always care for His creation. Moreover, through creation God manifests and saves. 2) Manifestation through the chosen servant of God: Isaiah 42:1-4 talks about God's manifestation through the chosen servant of God. The Lord called His servant to be a light to the nations. HE manifests the Father through HIS person. At the end of the Gospel story we see that a Gentile Centurion says 'Truly, this man was the Son of God'—after he witnessed HIS power in submitting to the will of the father in silence and humiliation of the cross. This shows how committed and obedient HE was to God and HIS calling. HE also manifested God HIS Father through His actions (Isaiah 42:7), Like HE opened the eyes of the blind, released the prisoner and also brought good news to all. Every miracle He performed, every word He spoke revealed His Father who called Him for this purpose. 3) Son of the Father and Father of the Son: Luke 3:22b says, "And the Holy Spirit descended on Him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased', this affirmation from heaven came at the time of Jesus's baptism. The first three evangelists recorded the statement of affirmation. The Baptism of Jesus was a revelation unto salvation. Baptism was an act of relationship. The one who is baptized becomes a child of God and God becomes his Father. Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee. This calling out from Nazareth has a significant for our baptism. Jesus left His family, (mother and brothers), His occupation,

(carpentry), His entanglements with the surroundings, the comfort and security of a home. This, He demanded even from His followers that they should be prepared to deny everything to be His disciples. In our baptism, the same thing applies a complete denial of our self-interests, our comfort zones and family and friends. When God called Jesus to be His Son to fulfil His Mission, He did not indulge in any of these excesses. He simply laid a responsibility on Jesus His Son to fulfil His Mission. So, our own discipleship to Jesus is demonstrated in fulfilling that responsibility at any cost.

12th January 2025 (Evening Service)

1st reading – Isaiah 42:1-7

2nd reading – Acts 8:26-40

Theme: "God's concern is to bring salvation to all humankind for which He called the Son".

Message by Rev. Devdas Matcha

John the Baptist was baptizing people to repent and prepare themselves for the coming of the Saviour. It implies that we must prepare ourselves for something to happen with our circumstances and ourselves. Perhaps this is true even when we enter this sanctuary. Without such expectation, we simply come and go and there is no change in ourselves or in our circumstances. We are in the season of Epiphany. Epiphany means "manifestation", and it is known as a Festival of Light. During the season of Epiphany God reveals and manifests Himself to us if we are truly and expectantly waiting for Him. God's revelation is always purposeful. 1) The Elements of Epiphany-the manifestation of God: In the scripture portions, we have heard God used to manifest Himself A) The Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit: The very first book of the Bible, Genesis begins with the Spirit of God. God's Sprit is already connecting the material world and the Divine being. Genesis 1:2 says, "and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." God's footprint was clearly seen in the order of creation and its self-propagation. He also instituted a language that tells of His glory. The psalmist therefore says that "the heavens declare the glory of God" in Psalm 19:1. Nature reveals the existence of God. Again, in the book of the prophet Isaiah, we see a reference to the Holy Spirit in Chapter 42:1 "I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations." It is a verse loaded with the call of the servant, giving him the knowledge of justice and even to realize the all-encompassing realm of God. This is all the work of the

Holy Spirit, And the Lord Holy Spirit continues to work. In Acts 8:29 we read "The Spirit told Philip, Go to that chariot and stay near it". That day God touched not only the life of the Ethiopian, but also of Philip. B) Angels, Stars, Fire: The second way of Manifestation that I would like to draw your attention to is through Angels, Stars and Fire. There are no limits to what God can use to manifest Himself. Across the Bible we read angels were God's messengers. God sends them to convey His messages even before He visits the place. In Amos 5:8 the prophet Amos says that Pleiades and the Orion, the seven sisters in the sky, were created by God to turn blackness into dawn and darkens day into night. In Deuteronomy chapter 4, Moses warned the Israelites not to think of the stars as gods and worship them because they are only God's instruments to reveal His glory. In addition, symbolism of fire was used several times to inform of God's presence with the people of Israel. The Lord revealed Himself to the Israelites there through the fire. 2) The message of Baptism: The first one is the Spirit Baptism. The Lord put His spirit in Him whom He called. The other is Water Baptism. Through our baptism, we become the members of the Body of Christ. That is where our mission begins. And Jesus is our model even for our own baptism. Conclusion: The season of Epiphany reminds us of God's revelation to us. We only can hear and see if we are open to God. Prayer, as Jesus practiced, opens us to God. God is interested in our joining His movement. Are we ready?

19th January 2025

1st reading – Isaiah 25:6-9

2nd reading – Galatians 3:23-29

Theme: 'Jesus brings joy through the fulfilment of God's gracious purpose' Message by Rev. Dr. Kenseelan Azariah

The Birth of Christ came as a good news to all the people in the world. The Angels gave the good news to the shepherds saying 'Peace on earth and goodwill towards men'; but humanity is still missing to understand the gospel message of peace and joy that would come through Christ alone. The purpose of Jesus' death was that no one should perish but everyone through Christ have eternal life. Yet, how many of us do understand the depth of HIS sacrifice? Why are we not able to experience true peace and joy as a result of faith in Christ's redemptive plan. *We have to make the Lord of peace as our own: 2 Thessalonians 3:16 'Now may the

Lord of peace Himself continually grant you peace in every circumstance.' Many a times things might go awry in our life, but if we hold on to the Lord we will face the tough times in peace and with sound mind just as the scripture says in 1Thessalonians 5:23 'Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ'. * Follow HIS commandments – we preach the gospel of Christ to others but if we fail to observe HIS commandments or fail to practice them, we fail to have true peace. Isaiah 48:22 says, "There is no peace," says the LORD, "for the wicked." * Only those who lead a righteous and holy life have true peace and joy in their life.

26th January 2025

1st reading – Nehemiah 5: 14-19

2nd reading – 1 Peter 2:11-16

Theme: 'Prayer for our country' Message by Rev. Milind Sojwal

All of us live in two different kingdoms. We live in the kingdom of this world and yet we are part of an eternal kingdom of God that shall never end. As Christians, we are called to obey the scripture (1Timothy 2:2), that we honour those who are in leadership positions, men and women who are ruling over us, because our God establishes them. At the same time God commands us to give God what is HIS alone (Praise and honour and glory and all that we have and are) as spoken by Jesus Christ in Matthew 22:21. When Jesus says give to Caesar, what is Caesar's and give to God what is God's, HE is essentially saying there is nothing that is outside the purview of God, everything is owned by God alone. The Bible tells us that we are HIS holy people, set apart for HIM alone, and that our ultimate allegiance is to the God who gave HIMSELF up for us. God calls us today to be faithful, serving and praying citizens of this country but ultimately acknowledge our citizenship in the kingdom of heaven.
